Michigan Leash Law

The State of Michigan Leash Law of 1919 requires that you keep your dog on a leash when not on the dog owner's property. This applies to walking your dog in the subdivision or in the Raintree Village Commons Areas.

Encroachments into Raintree Village Commons Areas

Encroachment is an intrusion onto another's property. Of the 810 homes in Raintree Village, 80 lots share a property line with one of the four commons areas. Of these 80 lots, several have made illegal encroachments into Raintree Village Commons areas, consisting of sheds, benches, underground lighting, potted plants, hammocks, shrubs, gardens and compost bins to name just a few.

Some of these encroachments were established by prior owners. Current owners may not know where their property lines are and are unknowingly continuing the encroachment.

All encroachments onto Commons land are illegal and not permitted by the Raintree Village Homeowners Association. We ask that homeowners whose property abuts one of the commons areas check their property surveys and vacate any encroachments they may have made into the commons areas.

Enter your address and click on "View Map" to see a map of your property including property lines and lot dimensions.

If you realize that you are encroaching on Raintree Village owned commons area property, please take action (weather permitting) to vacate the encroachment.

Keep Raintree Village Clean

A weekly advertisement newspaper is delivered to all homes in Raintree Village every Sunday. This paper is inside a plastic bag and placed on the driveway or on the lawn near the mailbox by the carrier.

Please do not pretend you do not see this newspaper. Ignoring it will not make it magically disappear. Either pick it up to read it or place it with your other paper recycling. Leaving these newspapers on your lawn or driveway for days (or weeks or months) gives the impression that Raintree Village is a mess of litter. If you live in a house that has a storm drain in the street along your property border, please keep it clear of debris. Blocked drains cause streets to flood during rain storms which can pose a hazard to driving. Use a garden rake to move the debris off of the drain and dispose of it in your yard waste container.

Each homeowner is responsible to clean up the leaves in their yard. This includes the leaves in the street gutter in front of the property. And please don't blow leftover grass and leaves into the street. **Online Payments** You can now make your RVHA dues payment online using a credit card. Just go to the www.rvha.org website and click on the "Dues" menu tab.

Paying online with a credit card incurs a processing fee $(3.5\%+0.45 \cong$ \$1.50) that goes to the credit card processing agent (RVHA only receives the dues amount). If you do not want to pay the credit card processing fee, then pay using a check or money order and mail in your payment.

Commons Areas Forest Commons, Village Commons, Abbey Commons and Lakeside Commons are the four commons areas within Raintree Village subdivision. Lakeside and Abbey have swing sets and benches and Forest Commons has a walking trail from the Sandburg entrance to the Stonetree entrance.

Enjoy using these commons areas, but treat them with respect to preserve them. Do not litter and clean up after your dog just as you would outside the commons areas. Do not damage any trees or plants inside the commons areas.

Dues are \$30

The Raintree Village dues for 2021 are \$30 for the year. This is a \$1 increase over the 2020 dues. The main costs facing us is the restoration of the shoreline of the detention pond at Lakeside Commons.

Improvements have been made at the inlet, outlet and west shore but more action is needed to prevent further erosion of the pond banks.

All past and currently planned expenditures by the RVHA board can be seen in the budget on the back page of your invoice.
